Day 1 | Depart gateway city

Day 2 | Budapest, Hungary

Arrive at Budapest Ferenc Liszt International Airport. Proceed through immigration and then to the baggage claim area to retrieve your luggage. After completing customs, AHI FlexAir passengers traveling on flights that qualify for the group arrival transfer and Cruise Program passengers who have purchased seats on the group transfer should exit the baggage claim area and proceed to the designated meeting spot, where an AHI Travel representative will meet you. The meeting location will be provided with your final documents.

Transfer to the pier and embark on the first-class MS Amadeus Mira river ship. The docking location of the ship will be provided in your final documents. Please note that if you arrive before check-in time, your cabin may not be immediately available.

Welcome Reception and Dinner. This evening, gather aboard the ship for a festive reception and dinner, a gracious opportunity to meet your fellow travelers and toast the beginning of your river journey—a delightful prelude to the experiences that await.

Day 3 | Budapest

Enjoy a full, freshly prepared breakfast aboard the ship each morning during your cruise.

The breathtaking capital of Hungary was once two cities, Buda and Pest, on opposite sides of the Danube until 1872, when Buda and Pest merged to form Budapest, with the river flowing through the city's center.

After breakfast, step ashore to set out on your chosen PYJ excursion below.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- Budapest Panoramic Tour. Set out by deluxe motor coach through the city's Buda and Pest sections, including some short stops along the way. Drive along the iconic, UNESCO-inscribed Andrásy Avenue, pass by the symbolic Heroes' Square, the Neo-Renaissance Hungarian State Opera House and the magnificent Neo-Gothic-style Parliament Building. In the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Buda Castle Quarter, see the 700-year-old Matthias Church, known for its colorful Zsolnay tiles, and take in the panoramic views from the Fisherman's Bastion. (Moderate; ideal for slow walkers)
- Local Cultural Immersion. Experience local life in Budapest today! Begin at the 19th-century Great Market Hall, the city's largest and oldest indoor market. Explore three levels of bustling stalls offering Hungarian foods and handcrafted folk art. Then, continue with a panoramic city tour, stopping at a traditional coffeehouse. Watch pastry chefs craft flaky strudel, then savor a tasting accompanied by coffee or tea, along with a sampling of Hungarian pálinka schnapps. (Moderate)
- Budapest's Jewish Quarter. Discover Budapest's rich Jewish heritage on a coach and walking tour of the historic Jewish Quarter. Visit the 19th-century Moorish Revival-style Dohány Street Synagogue, Europe's largest synagogue. Next, pass by the nearby Weeping Willow Tree memorial park and then explore the Holocaust Memorial Center, which preserves the memory of the 600,000 Hungarian Jews who perished during the Holocaust. Conclude by pausing at the poignant Shoes on the Danube Bank memorial. (Moderate) Note: If the tour falls on a Saturday or a Jewish holiday, the Great Synagogue is closed to visitors. You will be able to view it from the outside and then visit the Páva Street Synagogue instead. If the tour falls on a Monday, the Holocaust Memorial is closed, so you will visit the Jewish Museum at the Great Synagogue.

Return to the ship for lunch, followed by the afternoon at leisure.

Dinner is served aboard the ship each evening, featuring a gourmet selection of both international and regional cuisine crafted by talented chefs. Savor artfully prepared dishes that highlight fresh, seasonal ingredients, paired with fine wines and attentive service. After dinner, relax in the lounge and enjoy nightly entertainment.

Budapest by Night. After dinner, the ship departs Budapest for Bratislava, Slovakia, on a memorable cruise. Glide past the city's most iconic landmarks aglow in the night. Take in the radiant Parliament Building, the stately Buda Castle and the graceful sweep of the Chain Bridge as you sail beneath its arches. It's a truly enchanting way to begin your cruise through the heart of Europe! (Mild)

Day 4 | Bratislava, Slovakia

Soak up the scenic views and relax as the ship cruises toward Bratislava. As you approach the medieval city, the striking silhouette of the futuristic Most SNP bridge, also known as the Bridge of the Slovak National Uprising, which spans the Danube, hints at the city's unique blend of history and modernity.

Enrichment: The Velvet Revolution & the Making of Slovakia. Learn about the Velvet Revolution, a pivotal moment that ended communism in Czechoslovakia and set the stage for the nation's peaceful division into the Czech Republic and Slovakia. Gain insight into Slovakia's emergence as an independent country and its cultural, political and social development.

After lunch and the enrichment lecture, disembark the ship for your chosen excursion below.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- Bratislava's Old Town & Café. Stroll through the medieval old town on a guided walk, marveling at St. Martin's Cathedral, once the site of Hungarian coronations. Admire the Neo-Renaissance Slovak National Theatre, the 14th-century St. Michael's Gate—the city's only remaining medieval fortification gate—and the Primate's Palace, where Hungarian archbishops spent their winters. Stop at a coffeehouse, located in a former bank hall, featuring art nouveau mosaics and views of the picturesque main square. Savor a traditional local pastry paired with a cup of coffee. (Moderate)
- Bratislava Old Town Musical History Walk. Discover the rich musical heritage of Bratislava, once home to composers such as Mozart, Beethoven, Haydn and Liszt. On a guided walk through the old town, pause at venues where these masters performed, taught or conducted premieres, including the Philharmonic Orchestra building and the famed Ventúrska Street, where Mozart is believed to

have performed in 1762. Stop near Zichy Palace to enjoy a performance by a talented young violinist and take in other old town highlights, including the 14th-century St. Michael's Gate. (Moderate)

- Hidden Vines of Bratislava. Venture outside the city for a scenic drive through charming Slovak villages, rolling vineyards and emerald pastures. Visit a local winery, where centuries-old winemaking traditions are still practiced. Learn about the region's distinctive grape varieties, including Grüner Veltliner, Welschriesling and Blaufränkisch, and discover how local vintners craft wines that reflect the unique terroir of the Danube region. Cap off your visit with a delicious tasting of crisp and aromatic Slovak wines. (Mild)

Return to the ship late this afternoon and unwind before dinner tonight.

The ship leaves Bratislava this evening, cruising for Vienna, Austria.

Day 5 | Vienna, Austria

This morning, the ship arrives in the elegant, European capital of Austria – Vienna, one of Europe's most celebrated cities. From its ornate palaces and world-class art galleries to its vibrant coffee culture and revered concert halls, Vienna's treasures are rich, varied and unforgettable.

Enrichment: Timeless Vienna. Join a discussion about Vienna, a city renowned for its elegance, history and artistic legacy.

After your discussion, step ashore to embark on your chosen PYJ.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- Imperial Vienna. Explore the sumptuous Imperial Apartments of Hofburg Palace, where lavish décor, intricate frescoes and gilded furnishings reflect centuries of Habsburg grandeur and imperial life. Then drive along the Ringstrasse, one of the world's most magnificent boulevards, lined with historic monuments, elegant townhouses and grand public buildings. Pass landmarks such as the University of Vienna—the oldest in the German-speaking world—the stately Houses of Parliament, the majestic Opera House, and striking monuments to Johann Strauss and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. (Moderate)
- Art & Wine: Klosterneuburg Monastery Wine Tasting. Perched above the Danube, the 12th-century Klosterneuburg Monastery is famed for its gilded copper Verdun Altar, a stunning example of medieval craftsmanship, and for housing Austria's oldest continuously operating wine estate. Explore the winding cellar as you learn about the centuries-old traditions of Austrian winemaking. Conclude your visit with a tasting of the estate's distinguished wines that capture the essence of this scenic region. (Moderate)
- Schönbrunn Palace & Gardens. Step into the magnificent summer residence of the Habsburgs, a UNESCO World Heritage site and a masterpiece of baroque architecture. Wander through the lavish State Apartments, each adorned with elegant frescoes, gilded moldings and period furnishings that evoke imperial opulence. Admire the sunlit grandeur of the Hall of Mirrors and stroll the stunning landscaped gardens, complete with fountains, statues and tree-lined avenues. (Moderate)

Free Time: Return to the ship for lunch and an afternoon at leisure. Complimentary shuttle service will run throughout the afternoon and evening between the ship and Schwedenplatz, Vienna's central square, for independent exploration.

The Viennese Waltz. Tonight, gather for a captivating performance of the Viennese waltz by professional dancers accompanied by a live musical trio. Then, take to the floor yourself to learn the steps of this classic and elegant dance, a quintessential experience of Viennese culture. (Mild-Moderate)

The ship departs Vienna late tonight, cruising for Dürnstein.

Day 6 | Dürnstein | Melk

Early this morning, the ship will cruise into the scenic Wachau Valley and arrive in Dürnstein, a beloved village in the heart of Austria's renowned wine-growing region. The town was once the seat of the medieval Kuenring dynasty and the site of the castle where King Richard the Lionheart was famously imprisoned.

Disembark for your selected discovery excursion below.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- Dürnstein Walking Tour. Take a guided stroll through the enchanting streets of Dürnstein, where baroque façades glow in the sunlight, and vineyards cascade down the hillsides to the sparkling Danube. Admire the charming scenery and breathe in the aroma of ripening grapes in this celebrated wine region. Step inside the magnificent Stift Dürnstein, the abbey church founded in 1410, and famous for its striking blue and white tower. Marvel at the elegant interior, which reflects centuries of history and devotion. (Moderate)
- Danube Cycling Adventure. Hop on a bicycle for a two-hour guided ride around Dürnstein and the scenic Wachau Valley. Explore sections of the 745-mile Danube Bicycle Trail, which stretches from Germany to Hungary, while passing lush vineyards, quaint villages and rolling hills framed by the glimmering river. Along the way, pause for a refreshing snack and take in the sweeping vistas that make this valley one of Europe's most picturesque regions. (Active)
- Wachau Valley Winery Visit & Tasting. Visit a charming local winery housed in a beautifully preserved historic building. Discover the region's winemaking traditions and sample its distinctive wines in the cellar, savoring flavors that reflect the unique terroir of the Wachau Valley. This celebrated area is particularly renowned for its Riesling and Grüner Veltliner, whose crisp, aromatic profiles perfectly capture the essence of the valley. (Mild)

Return to the ship for lunch and take in the beauty of the villages, monasteries and castles as you glide through the Wachau Valley, a UNESCO World Heritage site renowned for its dramatic landscapes and historic charm, en route to Melk.

Melk Abbey. Arrive in Melk and step ashore once again to visit the renowned Benedictine abbey, a UNESCO World Heritage site and a baroque architectural jewel dating back to 1736. Admire the stunningly beautiful interiors and spectacular views of the mighty Danube from the abbey's terrace. After the tour, you can walk downhill through the small, charming town center or take a motor coach to return to the ship. (Moderate)

The ship cruises for Passau, Germany tonight.

Day 7 | Passau, Germany

Arrive in Passau, beautifully situated at the confluence of the Danube, Ilz and Inn rivers. Step ashore to discover the picturesque "City of Three Rivers."

Passau & St. Stephen's Cathedral. Take a guided walk through Passau's charming Altstadt, where remnants of medieval fortifications still stand. Wander along the Residenzplatz, one of the most beautiful baroque squares north of the Alps. Admire the historic Rathaus Town Hall, featuring a Renaissance façade and a striking clock tower. Across the river on the left bank, behold the medieval Veste Oberhaus fortress, founded in 1219, perched on a hill. Continue strolling along narrow cobblestone streets, pausing to view the 18th-century Neue Residenz, the New Bishop's Residence, a stunning Viennese baroque palace that was once home to Passau's prince-bishops; and the Alte Residenz, the Old Bishop's Palace, dating to the 14th century. Situated at the highest point of the prominent Domplatz square, the Old Residence has long been the center of ecclesiastical power in Passau. See the Niedernburg Monastery, a historic Benedictine nunnery where Gisela, Queen of Hungary, spent her later years as Abbess. Her tomb is in the adjoining Holy Cross Church.

During your tour, visit the 15th-century, baroque St. Stephen's Cathedral, which houses the world's largest cathedral organ – with 17,974 pipes and 233 registers that produce a truly majestic sound. The cathedral's site has been occupied by a church since the 8th century, with the current structure completed in 1688. Inside, the breathtaking white and gold baroque interior is adorned with ornate ceiling frescoes depicting biblical scenes in exquisite detail. (Moderate)

Free Time. Return to the ship for lunch and then head back into Passau to pursue your individual interests this afternoon.

The ship departs Passau in the late afternoon, cruising for Regensburg.

Day 8 | Regensburg

Wake this morning to the gentle rhythm of the Danube as you approach Regensburg, a once-prosperous medieval merchant city set at the confluence of the Danube, Ilz and Inn rivers. Rich in history, Regensburg reveals Roman ruins, Gothic, Romanesque and baroque churches, as well as a vibrant tapestry of 12th- and 13th-century houses.

Enrichment: The Main-Danube Canal. After breakfast, gather with a local expert to discuss the history, construction, and importance of the legendary Main-Danube Canal, Europe's greatest man-made passageway, which connects the Main River to the Danube River. Completed in 1992, it was Emperor Charlemagne's vision more than 1,000 years ago.

Regensburg & Thurn und Taxis Palace. Disembark the ship and begin a guided walk to explore Regensburg, one of Germany's most charming towns. See the ancient Roman tower and gateway of Porta Praetoria and walk across the 12th-century Stone Bridge. Admire the bright yellow Altes Rathaus and the Old Town Hall, dating back to the 1200s, and gaze upon the soaring St. Peter's Cathedral with its mesmerizing stained-glass windows. Conclude your visit with a guided tour of the Thurn und Taxis Palace, a former Benedictine monastery that features a magnificent ballroom and an opulent throne room, showcasing centuries of aristocratic elegance. (Moderate)

This afternoon, the ship cruises for Nuremberg, entering the Main-Danube Canal later today.

Day 9 | Nuremberg

The cityscape of Nuremberg greets you this morning! Home to Europe's first printing press, Nuremberg is often associated with expansions in science and technology. Ancient city walls from the 14th and 15th centuries lead to medieval gates and towers, while the imposing twin-towered Gothic St. Lorenz church watches over the town.

Disembark the ship to begin your PYJ election below.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- Nuremberg Sightseeing. Embark on a panoramic drive through the city, passing the historic courthouse where the World War II trials were held, a site steeped in global significance. Then enjoy a guided walk through charming streets, taking in the imposing hilltop castle and its scenic courtyard. In the bustling Hauptmarkt square, marvel at the intricate 14th-century Gothic Schöner Brunnen fountain, the city's iconic centerpiece. Admire the striking 14th-century Frauenkirche, also known as the Church of Our Lady, and the soaring medieval St. Lorenz Church, both testaments to Nuremberg's rich architectural heritage. Return to the ship for lunch. (Moderate)
- History of the Nazi Party Rallies. During the years leading up to World War II and throughout the conflict, Nuremberg was a central hub for the Nazi Party and its propaganda activities. Visit a specially curated Interim Exhibition in the Large Exhibition Hall at the Documentation Center to uncover the history of the Nazi Party Rallies and the expansive Rally Grounds. Explore the ideological and political machinery behind the rallies, learn about the architecture and symbolism used to project power and gain insight into the devastating impact of Nazi policies on Germany and the world. Return to the ship for lunch. (Moderate)
- Franconian Switzerland Tour & Distillery Visit. Journey north from Nuremberg through picturesque Franconian villages and rolling countryside. Explore the Franconian Switzerland Museum to discover the region's traditional way of life, then visit the historic Gößweinstein Abbey, founded in 1127, a cherished pilgrimage site perched above the valley with breathtaking views. Continue to a local distillery where orchard-grown fruits are transformed into fine schnapps and savor a tasting of these artisanal spirits. Conclude the morning with a delightful lunch at a charming traditional inn. (Moderate) Note: If this excursion is chosen, you will have lunch during the tour and miss most of your free time in Nuremberg.

Free Time: After lunch, you are free to head back into Nuremberg to explore at your own pace. A shuttle service will be available this afternoon between the ship and the city center.

The ship departs Nuremberg this evening, cruising through the Main-Danube Canal for Bamberg.

Day 10 | Bamberg

Arrive in the endearing city of Bamberg early this morning. The UNESCO World Heritage-inscribed city is spread across seven hills. Its winding cobblestone lanes, well-preserved medieval architecture, baroque churches and charming atmosphere make Bamberg a cultural gem in the Franconia region of Bavaria.

After breakfast, step ashore to set out on your chosen Bamberg excursion below.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- B amberg Walking Tour. Embark on a guided walking tour of Bamberg's old town. See the 17th-century statue of Neptune in the Alte Hofhaltung, Old Court, a striking example of baroque artistry that sits atop an intricately designed sea-themed fountain. Stroll beneath the Grand Rococo Archway of the 18th-century Obere Brücke bridge, an outstanding example of dramatic Rococo architecture, and gaze at the sweeping panoramic views of this storybook town. (Moderate)
- B amberg Culinary Delights. Set out on a walking culinary tour of Bamberg, where Franconian and Bavarian traditions come to life. Pause briefly at a local bakery, butcher, deli and candy shop, savoring the flavors of the region. Along the way, sample Bavarian specialties such as the city's renowned licorice, leberkäse (meatloaf), obatzda (cheese spread), Bretzels, a glass of Bavarian beer and a small cake. (Moderate) Note: The culinary tour takes place outside, with brief standing stops to sample local specialties while learning about the region's cuisine. Samples may vary by season and the timing of the culinary tour.

Return to the ship, now docked in Hassfurt, for lunch and the remainder of the afternoon at leisure.

The ship cruises for Würzburg tonight.

Day 11 | Würzburg

In this romantic corner of Bavaria, the historic Franconian city of Würzburg reveals a tapestry of architecture rich with centuries of stories. Its vibrant Old Town is graced with splendid churches, among them the Gothic St. Mary's Chapel and the Baroque Neumünster Collegiate Church. Spanning the Main River, the venerable Old Main Bridge, or Alte Mainbrücke, stands adorned with statues of saints — a striking emblem of the city's enduring heritage.

Disembark the ship this morning for your chosen excursion below.

PYJ | Personalize Your Journey | Choose ONE of the following excursions and return the included PYJ Reservation Form with your selection by the deadline noted on the form.

- Würzburg Residenz & City Walk. Begin with a visit to the renowned Würzburg Residence, built between 1720 and 1744. The majestic UNESCO World Heritage site is one of Europe's finest secular baroque palaces. On a guided inside tour, gaze at the sumptuously decorated Imperial Hall, the Hall of Mirrors and an impressive staircase featuring a brilliant fresco. Continue on a walking tour of this old Franconian city to see St. Kilian's Cathedral, the Neumünster Church, the Old Town Hall, the scenic market square and more. (Moderate – Active; there are a fair number of stairs to navigate at the residence)
- The Romantic Road & Rothenburg. Set out by deluxe motor coach along the Romantic Road, once a vital trade route in the Middle Ages. This storied corridor traces a historic path through the foothills of the German Alps and the Franconian wine country. As you travel through tranquil medieval villages and charming Bavarian towns, take in the half-timbered houses, flower-trimmed lanes and fairy-tale castles that define the landscape. Stop to visit Rothenburg, one of Germany's most enchanting and best-preserved medieval towns, still surrounded by its original 14th-century walls. Within this storybook setting, half-timbered houses, cobbled lanes and soaring towers evoke the romance of a bygone era. (Moderate)

Free Time: Return to the ship for lunch, followed by time to explore Würzburg at leisure this afternoon.

The ship departs for Miltenberg early this evening.

Day 12 | Miltenberg

Spend this morning relaxing on board as you cruise along the scenic Rhine.

Frühschoppen! Make your way to the deck mid-morning for a truly memorable experience. Savor traditional German beer while sampling a tempting spread of Brezeln (pretzels), weißwurst (sausages) and flavorful mustards, all while mingling and soaking in the riverside ambiance. (Mild)

As the ship cruises, relax in the heated indoor pool, Vital wellness club, or hair salon, or simply stroll along the deck, admiring the panoramic river views.

Early this afternoon, the ship arrives in Miltenberg. Disembark to discover the romantic town.

City of Miltenberg. A walking tour of Miltenberg reveals traditional half-timbered houses, quaint taverns and a decorative, 16th-century octagonal fountain. See the Town Hall and Germany's oldest working inn, named Riesen, which means giant, and take in its storybook façade. Stop at St. Kilian Kellerei, a wine shop that sits over a 15th-century, vaulted ice cellar. Today, ice is no longer stored there, but it is a charming spot for you to enjoy a tasting of Franconian brandies. (Moderate)

Return to the ship and begin cruising toward Koblenz.

Day 13 | Koblenz

Relax on deck this morning while cruising through one of the most gorgeous areas of Germany as the ship makes its way through the Upper Middle Rhine Valley, a particularly scenic stretch with castles and vineyards peppering the steep hills. At the narrowest point of the Rhine River, see the famous bronze Loreley Statue, representing the mythical siren Lorelei, a figure from German folklore who was said to sit atop the Lorelei Rock.

Enjoy lunch on board before arriving in Koblenz, where the Moselle and Rhine rivers meet. Step ashore to explore a city rich in medieval history, dotted with striking monuments, an imposing fortress and charmingly quirky fountains.

- Koblenz Walking Tour. Set out on a guided stroll through the historic streets of Koblenz, a city shaped by more than 2,000 years of history. Founded by the Romans at a strategic river confluence, the city reveals its past in landmarks such as the elegant Town Hall, the medieval Liebfrauenkirche, Church of Our Lady, the imposing Alte Burg, Old Castle, the Altes Kaufhaus, Old Merchants' Hall, and the dramatic Deutsches Eck, German Corner, crowned by the commanding monument to Emperor Wilhelm II. (Moderate)
- Ehrenbreitstein Fortress. A cable car whisks you to this famous battlement perched on a rocky promontory high above the Rhine and Moselle rivers. Constructed in its present form between 1816 and 1832, Ehrenbreitstein is the second-largest preserved fortress in Europe, with origins dating to the 11th century. Enjoy a guided tour of the Koblenz State Museum's exhibits to learn about the fortress's storied history. Admire the stunning panoramas from this vantage point overlooking Koblenz and the surrounding rivers. (Moderate)

Return to the ship for dinner, or you may choose to remain in Koblenz and find a restaurant for dinner on your own.

Free Time: The rest of the evening is yours to enjoy at your leisure as you continue exploring Koblenz.

The ship departs Koblenz late tonight, cruising overnight for Cologne.

Day 14 | Cologne

Cologne Walking Tour & Kölner Dom. Take a guided walk through Cologne's historic quarter and stop to visit the famous 12th-century Kölner Dom, also known as the Cologne Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Before you enter, note the façade, which features twin towers that rise to a height of 515 feet, as well as the pointed arches, ribbed vaults and soaring spires. Inside the Gothic-style cathedral, admire the wooden Gero Crucifix, dating back to the 10th century; the Shrine of the Three Kings, a stunning gilded sarcophagus located behind the high altar; and the vibrant, intricate stained-glass windows, some of which date back to the medieval period. (Moderate)

Return to the ship for lunch and an afternoon of scenic sailing toward Amsterdam.

Farewell Reception and Dinner. Raise a toast to your once-in-a-lifetime cruising adventure along storied rivers through Europe's heart at this evening's reception and dinner aboard the ship.

Admire the architectural gems, bustling waterfronts and hidden courtyards that give this vibrant city its unique character and timeless charm. (Moderate; getting on and off the boat requires climbing up and down steep steps that are rocking in the water)
